At least once a year, Christians remember Jesus' prayer for his disciples that "they may be one so that the world may believe" (see John 17:21). Hearts are touched and Christians come together to pray for their unity. Congregations and parishes all over the world exchange preachers or arrange special ecumenical celebrations and prayers services. The occasion for this special experience is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Traditionally, the week is celebrated between January 18th and 25th, between the feasts of St. Peter and St. Paul. Each year since 1968, the World Council of Churches and the Roman Catholic Church have invited ecumenical partners to furnish liturgical texts based on a biblical theme to guide the celebration. In 2018, the churches of the Caribbean were chosen for this task. Recognizing the hand of God in the ending of enslavement—a painful reality that has deeply marked the history of the Caribbean peoples—these churches chose the song of Moses and Miriam in Exodus 15:1–21. This song celebrates the saving action of God which brings freedom.

For our service we have adhered to this theme and adapted the liturgy to our own context here in Holland. May God's Spirit unite our hearts as we worship God together!



#### Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, one in Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate: he suffered, died, and was buried; on the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father; he will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

How good it is when all earth's people dwell in peace together: There is where God will pour the blessing, life forevermore. *Refrain* 


